There were 22 proposed amendments to the National American Legion Auxiliary's Constitution & Bylaws. These were discussed in length during the Illinois Caucus and then voted on during the Tuesday session by our delegates. The most controversial amendment was the dues increase of \$6.00. National dues will go from \$12 up to \$18. This does not take affect until next year for the 2024 membership year. Please be sure this is discussed at your unit meetings and that your Constitution & Bylaws reflect the increase.

The Department of Illinois was mentioned for reporting 104 scholarships to National. It was great to look up on the screen and see several familiar faces from Illinois. That would have been National Treasurer Marybeth Revoir, National Finance Chairman and PNP Sharon Conatser and National Constitution & Bylaws Chairman Pam Ray. There were other member's pictures on the screen throughout the convention.

There was another proud moment when Illinois was recognized for the award won by Liberty Unit #289 of Strasburg. They won first place in the Central Division for their Education Report as well as first place in the Central Division for their VA&R report. Strasburg was one of eleven units that won the National President's Unit Award of Excellence. All they did was submit a report. Just think if all our Units did that. Think about it for next year.

CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS

The Constitution & Bylaws committee will "Keep Smiling While giving Hugs For Our Heroes."

There is an awesome template available on the Department website for updating constitution and bylaws for Units, Districts and Divisions. I strongly encourage all units, districts and divisions to check and make sure you have up to date documents. Using that template, the documents on file at Department are more consistent in structure.

As you review the template available on the website for your use, notice the change in the Eligibility section. "Wives" has been changed to "spouses" and the eligibility dates have been updated. This is important. Don't forget to include your Standing Rules.

You need to send your constitution and bylaws to me for review. If there are any questions, I will contact you. They will no longer be marked "approved," they will be marked "received." After receipt and review, you will be notified that I received them and I reviewed and sent them to Department for filing.

At the July 2022 Department Convention, we voted on the proposed changes to the Constitution & Bylaws and approved the following changes. There were housekeeping changes from Committeewoman to Committeeperson. Other changes were on the representation and length of term for the National Executive Committeeperson and the Alternate National Committeeperson. The Department Constitution & Bylaws will be updated and posted on our Department website.

At the National Convention, there was a vote on raising the membership dues. Starting the membership year of 2024 you will need to send to Department Headquarters \$29.00 instead of \$23.00 for senior members. Please remember to keep this in mind as it will help you decide if you need to vote to raise your unit dues to cover the National dues increase for the 2024 membership year.

One more award under this chairman's umbrella is the Serve and Protect Cadet of the Year plaque. This will be for the outstanding cadet at the American Legion Police School. The award will be presented at the end of the Police school week.

We all are one when we support our country and the American beliefs it was founded on. Raise your flag, show your spirit in your community and hold tight our right of freedom.

HOLDIAY GIFT SHOP

"Celebrating our heroes at the holidays and throughout the year"

The two Holidays that the American Legion Auxiliary provides financial support through the Department of Illinois to Veterans are the Holiday Gift Shops at Christmas and the Easter Program.

The Holiday Gift Shops are for the Veterans confined to V.A. facilities to be able to give a gift to their loved ones at the Holidays. They are given the choice of \$10.00 gift cards from Walmart, Target or McDonalds which the Auxiliary then sends to the Veteran's loved ones. The purpose of the Gift cards is for the Veteran to have a gift to give His or Her loved ones for the Holiday. They are not for the personal use of the Veteran. The Veteran will be remembered with a gift through the Gift for Yanks Program. The Veteran is allowed one Gift Card for their Spouse and one for each child living at home under the age of 18. If there is no living Spouse or children, the Veteran is allowed one Gift Card to give to a parent or representative.

The Easter Program provides a card and \$5.00 to each Veteran in the V. A. Facilities, Nursing homes, rehab, and assisted living facilities throughout the state. Veterans confined to their homes are also included. The Units will report the qualifying Veterans in their area and an Easter Card and \$5.00 will be issued the Unit Treasurer for Distribution. Veterans confined to the VA facilities will be included by the Reps of each facility.


