Thank you to all our volunteers who have been able to get back to volunteering in the hospitals and those who are caring for veterans in other ways. All are important to our ongoing mission to veterans.

Thank you to all our new volunteers. Your service is so important to our veterans and to the Representatives at the VA's.

The 2023-2024 volunteer reporting window will end on March 31. All hours volunteered should be sent to me or department by the end of April. Hours not submitted by then will go on 2024-2025 totals. As of this writing we have 40 active volunteers for both hospital hours and service to veteran hours.

Remember hospital hours are counted for hours that you volunteer at a veteran's hospital or CBOC. Service to Veterans hours are counted for hours you volunteer at a veteran's home, or hours you volunteer to help a veteran, send cards, make quilts for or take to appointments, etc. There are lots of ways to earn service to veteran hours. Don't forget that caregivers can count 10 hours a week for service to veterans.

National essay contest entries must be to this chairman by March 30, 2024, no exceptions.

ATTENTION, ATTENTION

It has come to our attention that one rule needs to be updated, we (I mean myself on the Education Committee) need to get with the program. Because National has changed a few rules and Covid-19 changed even more. The Department of Illinois Education rules need to be being changed.

INSTEAD OF THREE LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATIONS, only TWO will be required. The NEW two letters of recommendations are as follow: First from either a school/clergy. Second from an adult citizen not a relative. THIS GOES IN TO EFFECT IMMEDIAYELY. If the application does have the three recommendations, it will NOT be disqualified for recommendations.

Please follow the rest of the rules. Only the recommendation rule has change. Don't forget that the Unit must have contributed to the Department Education Fund before March 15, or their student will not qualify for a Scholarship from the Education Committee.

Children & Youth

Calling on all mini-heroes from the universe to help protect and serve the home front, while our heroes are out battling bigger villains and criminals. We need to improvise, adapt and overcome!

As Gwen Stacey, alias Ghost-Spider, I've been spinning webs, traveling around making it my responsibility and prioritizing the lives of children to give them support at school when so many children are traumatized and need that extra help. Trying to give support and comfort to those with disabilities and severe medical conditions. The last part is remembering and helping our mini-heroes of our deployed who seem to be uprooted, not having friends to bond with, struggling at home and school because of missing the parent who is gone on their civic duties, and feeling that they are not important or taking on extra duties.

Easter is around the corner. Hosting and helping by participating in events in the community or add some events of our own involving the Legion Family. Maybe a Bunny breakfast, bunny farm, egg scavenger hunt for the family, crafts and activities and more. Get children to help with good directions.

April is the month of the military child. Help them shine in school doing announcements, have them give reports and talks to where they have traveled. Wear a button of their family member who may be a Veteran or active duty. Have a day when the other parent can come into the class and help their child answer questions. Help with a wall of heroes and pictures. Have movie nights with the military kids movies and Top Gun 1 and 2 and Black hawk Down or any other movie for the teenage kid. Display those mini heroes up to the age 17 at the Legion. Have them set up booths of inspiration. Also, do some fun things that help them take their mind off of worrying while the parents are gone. Have a special dinner; let them help with cooking and serving. Use the strengths of the town to do a community event. Step out of the box and get them involved with civilian children. Have kids wear red every Friday to remember the deployed.

Proclamation will be sent out to your division and district chair or presidents in some circumstances to give out to the units. Take it to your local mayors to officially make April 15th the special day for everyone to recognize the military child and wear purple to show our support. Please take it in as soon as you get it, it takes time and some boards have to vote. After the signature gets the message out in your city or town so everyone can see. Design a purple-up shirt that everyone can wear. Make it a contest at school with each class to wear the most purple. Have teachers post pictures. Send in pictures to Dr. Coral Grout of your Legion Family wearing purple.

Here is the 3-year plan for a national request. The pilot part has been a struggle financially. National Children and Youth want us to be involved in doing things for the children of the deployed. Most of the military children are uprooted, don't have the diversity, worry about the family member missing, having to grow up faster and help step in to take care of family, have a lack of friends, and begin to struggle in school. I want to give them something to store their own personal treasures in to take wherever they go. They would get a sticker of the auxiliary, and a decal of the branch that their parent serves in. They could get decals of super heroes as well. I'm working on getting a book for each child with scholastics if anybody might have a better connection. We would like to put a couple wristbands and flat rocks with a paint box inside. This part would be your responsibilities. Snacks, cool designed socks, bath bombs, stationary, action figures of super heroes for the littles, bracelets, necklaces, or key chains for the older children are suggestions or you may find other things to go in it, like a care package you would send to the deployed. Units close by each other can contribute together. We have some parents that are being deployed in different branches just within the last 3 months to present. Next year we would reach out to deployed and active duty families. The last year would be when Dr. Coral Grout would be National President, and we would reach out to any new active duty families and the young Veterans that served in Enduring Freedom and Operation Iraqi, or any other war at this time. The set up fees are the largest, after that they are not as expensive. We are including the bracelets and rocks for the suicidal that are very big in Illinois. If we can get one child to "Be the One to See the One" and get them help. We can't save them all but we sure can try. Legionnaire YiaYia from Wisconsin is my mentor. I enjoyed hearing her speak about helping children in Wisconsin.

Special Olympics have made many changes in the last 6 years and again we are going through a big change. They want to go through food changes moving forward that follow the 2024 healthy food guidelines. It wipes out a
