
Greetings,

How do we...?

Are you a new member, or a member of many seasons, who wonders how or why things are handled a certain way? Do we need to have a motion, discussion and vote on projects discussed in a meeting that we want to implement? Read the Unit Constitution and Bylaws and Standing Rules. This document is the backbone of our organization and gives us the guidelines to follow to help our veterans, active military and their families, and our community through our projects and programs. The template for the Unit Constitution and Bylaws, <u>which conforms with the Department and National documents and does not conflict</u>, is available on the Department website: <u>https://ilala.org</u>, click on Programs, then Member Organizational Support, then Constitution and Bylaws, then Read More, then Unit Constitution. Also, written and video instructions are available.

Be sure to verify that the dues amount set by your Unit is sufficient to cover the per capita sent to Department and National.

I encourage ALL Units to update their Constitution and Bylaw's this year. Our wonderful department staff, and volunteers, have made this project so easy to complete. At district, county and division meetings, share the importance of this responsibility with all attendees. There are many Units who don't update their C&B's, and some don't even know if there is a copy available and where it might be.

Connie Boxleitner, Pat Kranzow, and I are all available to help you. We (and the officers of the Department) would like to see a really good response this year for updating Unit Constitution and Bylaws. If you have questions, contact one of us.

As members of the American Legion Auxiliary, we strive to support our veterans in their physical as well as their mental health/needs by "<u>BUILDING SUPPORT FOR OUR VETERANS</u>"

As "Be the One" has been our "Legion Family MOTTO", the past two years, we must continue it by serving our Veterans by being involved and being AWARE!

What can we do? **<u>BY GETTING INVOLVED</u>**:

- Supporting the therapeutic rehabilitation and healing of veterans by raising awareness of healing through arts, crafts, and hobbies. Remember the National Creative Arts Festival will be held in Indianapolis May 11-18, 2025. What a Great Opportunity to attend and it is close to us!
- Learn who is considered a caregiver. This will help you identify caregivers in your community and maybe even as a caregiver yourself.
- Volunteer at local VA facilities, including state VA facilities in your area. We need Volunteers at all facilities. Many were lost with the shutdowns of COVID and are desperately needed. Consider being one.
- Collaborate with organizations that support veterans and their families, such as Wreaths Across Americas, Honor Flight Inc., and the Military and Veteran Caregiver Network.
- Look in your community for opportunities to support veterans, their caregivers, their families, and their survivors. Take the Time to do Buddy Checks. You will be surprised what a simple phone call will do, to let them know you care.

Above all, report your ALA Service to Veterans hours to your Unit VA&R chair.

When donating to the VA&R Six Point program, remember to note which of the Six Point Program your donation is for. To be recognized for completion of the Six Point Program, each Point must be completed.

Any donations to Hospitals and Facilities, you must designate to whom your donation is for.

Six Point Program

As we start our year, let us remember that we are Building Support for our Veterans. And as a new fiscal year begins, I would like to remind everyone of the Six Point Program! This program is consists of ways we can give to our veterans.

They are the Treasure Chest, Canteen Books, Fresh Fruit, Christmas Gift Shop, Easter Gift, and VA Nursing Homes. All of these are listed on your ALA Department of Illinois Master Snip Sheet. Monetary donations help support these programs and enable items to be purchased for the Christmas Gift Shops, as well as gift cards that enable the hospitalized veterans to purchase items for themselves that may not be available in the canteens. Poppy funds may be used for these programs.

Each Unit who gives to each of these programs by December 31st, will receive a Six-Point Program Certificate at the Patriotic Conference.

I hope this clarifies any questions you may have on this program.

Auxiliary Emergency Fund Chairman Suzie Weiss

Hard times can fall upon us at any moment. That's when the American Legion Auxiliary in 1969 created the AEF program and is still helping fellow Auxiliary members get back on their feet. An Auxiliary Emergency Fund grant may provide immediate emergency assistance to eligible American Legion Auxiliary members in areas devastated by natural disasters, such as fire, flood, hurricane, tornado, earthquake, and/or other severe weather. It is also granted to provide temporary assistance to eligible American Legion Auxiliary members during a time of financial crisis when no other source of aid is readily available to pay for past due expenses related to their primary residence and/or for basic household utilities. Grants may be awarded up to \$3,000.00 with the intent to help members who have suffered a financial setback and offer a helping hand to help re-establish financial stability. Assistance will not be granted to pay medical expenses, credit card debt or any other expenses not related to shelter or basic household utilities.

For both, Disaster and Financial Assistance you must have maintained annual ALA membership for three consecutive years (the current year and immediate past two years). For Disaster, the application must be received within 6 months of the disaster. You should be able to provided information such as photos of damage to the residence, itemized receipts for emergency expenses, damage repair estimates and other information as requested. For Hardship, the applicant must be able to provide copies of past due bills for shelter, basic household utilities, documentation for loss of income, and other information as requested. And for both only one AEF grant per grantee will be awarded in a 12-month period.

Since the Auxiliary Emergency Fund was established, more than \$6 million has been awarded to more than 6,500 members. To continue providing this assistance, we need your generous support so please donate today and know that you are helping made a better tomorrow for you fellow Auxiliary members.

Time to make plans for NATIONAL POPPY DAY May 25, 2025.

Poppy day is celebrated in countries around the world. The America Legion Family brought National Poppy Day to the United States by asking Congress to designate the Friday before Memorial Day as National Poppy Day.

On the Friday before Memorial Day, wear a red poppy to honor those fallen and support the living who have worn our nation's uniform.

The red poppy is the nationally recognized symbol of sacrifice worn by Americans since World War I to honor those who served and died for our country in all wars. It reminds Americans of the sacrifices made by our veterans, while protecting our freedoms.

Led by the American Legion Auxiliary, each year members of The American Legion Family distribute poppies with a suggestion that the person receiving the flower make a donation to support the future of veteran's active-duty military personnel and their families with medical and financial needs.

Educate your community using the image and story of the Flanders Field poppy to educate people about the sacrifices our military and service members. This helps us raise awareness of the Legion Family and connect us to the mission in the eye of the public. Encourage the American Legion, Sons of the American Legion, Legion Riders, and ALA Junior members to join poppy distribution in your community.

Offer to speak at local civic engagements about the meaning and significance of the poppy and how Poppy funds help veterans and their families. There are many ways individuals and groups can help bring greater awareness for the symbolic flower, honor our fallen and support heroes on National Poppy Day.
